### MIDLAND WEST LITERACY REPORT:

Literacy programs at CASA de Amigos continue right on through the summer even though schools in the community are taking conventional breaks. All age groups are welcome & active in the summer learning programs at Casa says Paul Brooks executive director. Therefore, a cadre of volunteers is needed to help 40-50 elementary-age students keep their reading skill current while participating in fun activities. The GED program enrolls students desirous of staying on course to receive their high school diploma - more volunteers needed here as well to help these teens. They need help so they can be successful - knowing how to read even the most simple sentences could make a difference.

Volunteers can name their time and day of the week. No training necessary - just willingness and the heart to help an under privileged child or teenager find confidence.

Our own Steve Castleserves on the board at Casa while Jeb Hughes encourages and provides employees to participate in an adult program called "Money Smart" where skills about budgeting, money management, opening a checking account, loans and even home ownership are taught free of charge.
