The Rotary Foundation's Permanent Fund has hit the \$500 million mark.

In September, the fund reached a total of more than \$505 million in expectancies and net assets, thanks to the contributions of dedicated Rotarians and supporters from around the world.

The fund, established in 1982, secures a strong future for the Foundation by providing additional income for all Foundation programs. Its dramatic growth has helped increase program support more than sixfold since 1994. For example, last Rotary year, the spendable earnings from the fund totaled \$4.9 million while the principal remained untouched.

HALLOWEEN FUN FACTS

CHOCOLATE candy bars top the list as the most popular candy for trick-or-treaters with Snickers #1.

Many experts believe the druids were the first to observe Halloween. Dating back to 700 B.C., they celebrated the festival of Samhain (the end of the harvest and a time to honor the dead) on November 1. In the ensuing years, the night before became known as the Eve of All Hallows, a.k.a. Hallow Even, a.k.a. Hallow e'en.

Ever wonder how trick-or-treating got started? On the evening before Samhain, people left food on their doorsteps to keep hungry spirits from entering the house. Festival goers started dressing in ghost, witch, and goblin costumes so wandering spirits would leave them alone. To this day, these are Halloween's most popular costumes

Jack o' lanterns originated in Ireland where people placed candles in hollowed-out turnips to keep away spirits and ghosts on the Samhain holiday. So this means the very first jack o' lantern was made out of a turnip.

Candy corn, anyone? Halloween is the sweetest holiday of the year, beating out Easter, Valentine's Day, and Christmas. In fact, one quarter of all the candy sold each year is purchased between September 15 and November 10 estimated sales at \$1.93 billion
