## *Mexico Projects*

We will gather at the Microtel in El Paso Texas. Departure for Mexico will be at 7:30 A.M. Thursday September 22. Many of us will travel to El Paso on Wednesday the 21st. and stay at the Microtel that evening. You will need to make your own hotel reservations in El Paso. Those who can are invited to join me and Governor Ted for a Dutch treat dinner at a local restaurant about 7:00 PM Wednesday.

We cross over into Mexico through Juarez. We will proceed to Madera Mexico where Thursday evening we will help our fellow Rotarians from the Madera Rotary Club package an assortment of school supplies purchased with funds we have previously sent them. These school supplies will be distributed to over 800 students in Madera and the surrounding mountain communities. Friday morning we assist the Madera Rotary Club distribute a few hundred packages to students in Madera. While in Madera there will be time for a look around this friendly community. I will spend some of my free time at the charming corner ice cream store. Next we will travel to Guerrero Mexico where, if circumstances

permit, we will visit a clinic sponsored by the Guerrero Rotary club. The restaurant on the square in Guerrero offers some of the best apple pie you have ever eaten.

Friday afternoon will find us in Creel Mexico near the Copper Canyon area. We will distribute some additional school supplies in the surrounding area and there will be time for some sight seeing and shopping. Saturday we visit a Tarahumara Indian village and visit the spectacular canyon rim at Divisadero Barrancas. Saturday night might find us in any of several locations as we prepare to make the final trek back to Texas on Sunday.

We are still firming up some of the plans and any time you go into the interior of Mexico you throw away time tables, relax and just enjoy. Remember the first rule of travel is be flexible and exact travel plans are always subject to change in Mexico.
