\$187,248.00

Your Foundation Dollars At Work

Thanks ROTARIANS!!!! As of May 25th, you have given \$187,248.00 to the Annual Giving Fund of the Rotary Foundation. This a record for the district, exceeding the \$178,738 total in 1997-98. In addition, over \$44,000 has been given in Restricted gifts to the Foundation. It will come back to reward us in three years with a 50% return from Rotary International.

The Rotary Foundation has issued 102 Paul Harris Fellows to District 5730 Rotarians and over 150 Multiple Paul Harris Pins during this Rotary year. Two Major Donor awards have also been presented.

Twenty six clubs have exceeded their goals for the year. Forty five clubs (85%) have given to the foundation. The missing clubs will be contacted to make a gift to the Foundation by June 30th. As of today, the club with the most **total giving** is **Big Spring Rotary Club**. The **most giving per member** is **Midland Day Break** with \$557.00 per member.

Lets all work together to make District 5730 a 100% giver by June 30th.

This week your District leadership team met and allocated \$5,250 in District Designated Funds to Disaster Relief in Mexico due to the hurricanes last fall. Our funds will be used to construct five small homes in Mexico, each having a commercial value of approximately \$8,000, for approximately \$4,800 thanks to partnering with a reputable Mexican NGO called Provivah and various Mexican Governmental Institutions.

Rotary and Provivah will give \$2,100 and every recipient family will give \$800 during the construction process before receiving the home so they get a true feeling of ownership. The families are also requested to stay for a minimum of 5 years in the community in order to receive their deed. The Mexican government will give land plus services such

as electricity, drainage, nearby school facilities and health clinics.

Thanks to the leveraging with Provivah and the various Mexican government Institutions, we are able to assist in giving a low-cost home for \$1,050, which will allow a family who suffered from the hurricane disasters to have a small home of approximately 360 square feet with approximately 1,000 square feet of land. These small homes are constructed in such a way that additional rooms can be added on by these families at a later date.

Our Rotary District will receive recognition from the communities involved.

Our Rotary Foundation Chairman Frank J. Devlyn will be personally involved with the committee for the homes in Mexico.
